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i. Audit updates

- With our accountant and new auditors, since summer, completed audits for 2017-18 and 2018-19. Current remaining audits: 2019-20, 2020-21, 2021-22.
- Current expected student fee receivable: \$130,000 (cheques pending).
- Currently paying out historical conference subsidy owings. Fulfilled Council reimbursements for 2021-22. Will fulfill SIF reimbursement for 2021-22 in Feb. 2023.
- ii. Class Gifts
 - Due to Class of 2T0 having already graduated, upon advices from their President and Vice-President of the 2T0 Class Council of their graduating year, UPS gladly accepts the following amounts payable to the Class of 2T0 as class gifts to UPS, hence waiving UPS's liability to fulfill these payables:
 - a. \$7,888.00: Student fees payable for the 2T0 Grad Fund.
 - b. \$7,040.00: 2T0 Grad Formal registration payments received by UPS.
 - c. \$7,707.80: The 2019-20 Career Fair money received from UofT, payable to the Class of 2TO.

iii. Motion: Council Endowment

- **Situation**: UPS is expecting an excess of historical students fees with expected completion of pending audits. Given the high turn-over rate of UPS Council, a long-term, sustainable method to utilize the funds is needed.
- Background:
 - a. Audits & monetary excess: Audits were on backlog since 2015-16 due to incident with then-engaged auditors. Significant efforts and costs were expended to bring audits to date (hiring of accountant, change of auditing firm, and student effort). On the other hand, pandemic and other factors (waiving of historical owings) have reduced expenses. After accounting for all historical payables, UPS still expects monetary excess of ~\$100,000 upon completion of 2020-21 audit, plus a year of student fees not included in this calculation, to be reserved for operations.
 - b. Endowment & payouts: An endowment is a pledge to make a donation to UofT to set up a fund, in/of an donor-specified amount, schedule, name, and purpose. This fund then becomes a perpetuity, with yearly payouts of interests generated of the donated amount (principle) (interest rate is around \$4% per annum). Each year's UPS Council then gets to decide where/how to spend the payout.
 - For context: UPS already has an endowment set up by a historical class, as a graduation support fund with annual payment of ~\$2,000.
 - c. **Non-bindingness**: Although entering into an agreement with UofT, there is no recourse to failing to fulfill the pledge on time (we are a donor after all!).
- Assessment:
 - An endowment totalling \$150,000 will produce yearly payouts of ~\$6,000, receivable each April.
 - b. Benefits of setting up an endowment:





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- i. Benefiting from an interest rate higher than typical bank saving accounts;
- ii. Current year of UPS Council gets to name the fund and purpose;
- iii. Safeguarding the excess money against potential inappropriate spending in (far) future Council years.
- c. Safety of setting up and endowment:
 - i. Non-binding: No recourse for failure to fulfill pledge or partial fulfillment;
 - ii. Fund safety: Donations are irreversible, but safety of payouts ensured by UofT's vast financial resources and likely longevity.

• Recommendation:

- a. UPS makes a pledge to donate a total of \$150,000 to UofT, of an installment of \$50,000 per year commencing before Dec. 2023 or earlier, through Dec. 2025, to setup up an endowment in the name of the "Undergraduate Pharmacy Society Council of 2022-2023 Fund", for the purpose of "supporting core activities and initiatives of the UPS, including hosting/subsidizing conferences, orientation/Phrosh activities, academic/social/athletic events, funding for student-led clubs, and/or student awards".

- iv. Motion: PDW 2020 subsidies inflation adjustment
 - Situation: Amounts owing to historical conference goers in 2020 are now paid out but possess less purchasing power due to significant inflation, and require inflation adjustment.
 - Background: PDW 2020 subsidy was approved by Council 2019-20 of a total of \$10,840 to be evenly distributed among the 100 delegates. Payable in Jan. 2020, this subsidy was delayed due to audit backlog, and only now issued. Due to inflation, purchasing power of this payout is significantly lower now than it would had been when due in Jan. 2020. According to the Canadian Consumer Price Index (Table 18-10-0004-01), CPI increased by 11.26% from Jan. 2020 (136.8) to Nov. 2022 (154.0) (available at the time of communication to delegates), increasing each delegate's amount to \$122.03. Overall, this incurs a cost increase of \$1,363 to UPS's budget.
 - Assessment:



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- a. Necessity: Evident reduction in money's purchasing power as experienced by everyone. Class of 2T3 also faces upcoming PEBC exam registration with a significant cost.
- b. Safety to budget: \$1,363 unlikely to make an impact on UPS's solvency.
- c. Risk of bias: PDW 2020's 100 delegates evenly comprised of all four enrolled classes at the time; hence low risk of class-motivated bias.
- **Recommendation**: Increase the total subsidy eligible to PDW 2020 delegates from \$10,840 to \$12,203, payable now.
